

Accessible Easygoing Walks

(1) Chew Valley Lake "The Grebe Trail"

Start Chew Valley Lake car park, OS Grid Ref: ST579610, (Explorer Sheet 155).

Distance 3/4 mile (1.2km)

Parking Car Park at start of trail. Parking free from September 30th to April 1st, otherwise small charge.

Accessibility Grebe Trail is hard surfaced, suitable for wheelchairs and pushchairs. It can be completed in about 35 minutes (excluding stops), by self-propelled wheelchairs. There is a café at the visitor centre in the other car park on this side of the lake, where light meals and other refreshments may be obtained. There are disabled toilets both outside and inside the café. The visitor centre is a 15 minute walk from the Grebe Trail, accessible when the ground is dry.

Other information Chew Valley Lake is 'man made' by Bristol Water when several farms along with their fields were flooded in order to make a reservoir. Bristol Water has continued to develop the area as an amenity site. The 'Grebe' Trail is a nature trail where various birds can be seen. There is a picnic area with tables and seats. Dogs are allowed on the site, but must be kept on a lead.
