- This Statement of Case is made by myself, Richard Davey, and is submitted in support of the Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order issued by Bath and North East Somerset Council on July 18th 2017.
 The DMMO seeks to record a Restricted Byway between St Catherine Lane at grid reference ST 7611 7106, along an existing track in a generally north-easterly direction for approximately 200m, to the border with South Gloucestershire at grid reference ST 7624 7121.
- I am a Company Director, based in London but living in rural north Essex.
 My wife and family run an arable farm and correspondingly we are well versed in the issue of footpaths and access.
- 3. I have used the route on foot from 1977 to 2018.
- 4. I have used the route on horseback from 1977 to 2004.
- I have used the route on bicycle or horse drawn vehicle from 1977 to
 2018
- 6. I have used the route by motorised vehicle from 1986 to 2004

- 7. Prior to 2012 I did not see any private signs or notices on or near the route that discouraged or encouraged me to use it. I have always understood it to be an undisputed footpath, bridle path.
- 8. I was once stopped on one occasion in the summer of 2016 while walking down Beaks Lane, away from Marshfield, by a lady who by deduction I worked out lived at Beak's Mill. She explained that the track going up the hill was not a footpath. I expressed my surprise at this and explained that I had been using it for nearly 40 years and believed it to be a right of way. She did not attempt to stop us continuing along it. She also moved on to explain at some length the ongoing battle she was having with the owners of the Paper Mill and that she was in dispute over boundary fences. This seemed to be her greater concern at the time, given the detail she was prepared to divulge during this casual meeting.
- 9. I have never been given permission to use the route.
- 10. As per the detail in point 8 I have met one person whom told me she lived at Beeks's Mill. Whether she is the legal landowner of the track– I have no Idea.
- 11. Before 2012 there was never any obstruction on the route. At the top of the track with Leigh Lane there was a wooden gate that was

generally closed but at no time in my memory locked. Use of the track was barred after 2012 by padlocked main gates and private signs at both ends. However, the smaller hunting gates were never locked and access was fine on foot / bicycle or horseback. Apart from the casual meeting in summer 2016 I never met anybody prior to 2012 and there was never any question raised over access either directly or indirectly through signage.

- I attach as evidence a copy of the Completed User Evidence Form submitted by myself dated April 20th, 2017
- and St Katherine's Valley. For all my life I have known and used this track for many forms of recreational activities walking, riding and cycling. In addition, I know many local people whom also have used this for many years. The alternative route would severely restrict and curtail this and is not as accessible and over grass field which in the middle of winter will be extremely muddy and restrictive. Cycling would be an extremely challenging to say the least. If walkers want to use a route across the fields, there is the footpath as 90 degrees which runs along the brook.

 Needless to say a semi hard track is much more usable than a grass footpath even more so if individuals are slightly less mobile or there are young children.

- 14. This track is extremely important in linking Cold Ashton to

 Marshfield and villages beyond like West Littleton and West Kingston
 through the network of back lanes, When I kept my horses at Cold Ashton
 it was key that I could access the quieter country lanes and link up to
 other destinations as even then the traffic on the A420 and A46 made
 them almost unusable. The same can be applied to all means and modes
 of transport as green lanes are
- 15. Although I no longer live full time in the area I regularly visit my mother whom still lives in Marshfield. St Katherine's Valley is an outstandingly peaceful place in today's world and access has never been an issue. This should continue to be enjoyed by new generations as I do with my own children.



Leigh Lane / Beeks Mill Footpath

I write regarding the above footpath / track and enclose the completed forms that you sent.

I moved to Cold Ashton as a one year old in 1968 and lived there until the death of my father in 2011. Since then I regularly visit my widowed mother who now lives in Marshfield.

I do think that it is essential that this footpath and track remains open to be used as it always has been as long as I can remember. It is an essential link between Marshfield, Cold Ashton and St Catherine's Valley and its loss would curtail a lot of people's activities.

From a young age, I have spent a great deal of time walking, riding, cycling or running to enjoy this area of outstanding natural beauty. Although I might have forgotten some of the detail over the years as to when gates etc have been erected or changed I have never questioned the fact that it was not a public right of way.

When I met the owner last summer and she stated that it was not a public right of way I was extremely surprised and questioned this with her as I had used it for well over 30 years. However, I have continued to use I in the manner to which I have always enjoyed it.

I do note the other footpath marked on your map but in all the years I have never used that once. I did not even know that particular one even existed. Also, in the winter the alternative route would be a potentially very muddy option and certainly not suitable for running or cycling.
