Works to begin at the end of June

Work to re-route all A36 through traffic onto Rossiter Road and restore Widcombe Parade to a pleasant village high street is set to start at the end of June and be completed by Christmas.

## Bath & North East Somerset Council Appoint ERH Construction Limited


## Did you know?

- Preparatory works have already been taking place. This has included early laying of new cables for a future supply for the University of Bath to minimise the need for future disruption.
- Work to trees took place at the beginning of March to avoid harm to nesting birds.
- Wood from the removed alder tree is now being used by children at Bathford Primary School as an outdoor classroom.
- The commemorative plaque to Cicely Edmunds, founder of the Widcombe Association, is being re-instated near Ha'penny Bridge pedestrian crossing.




