Some of the buildings and structures are in use. Many are underused or have fallen into disrepair.





Our Thoughts

The existing play area is located in one of the most isolated parts of the Gardens between the busy Beckford Road and the railway line, and first-time visitors to the Gardens often struggle to find it. Though there is a high wall along the roadside boundary, the play area still suffers from traffic noise and pollution. There is plenty space for informal ball games as well as shrubs to play hide and seek in, but relatively little play equipment, and what there is, offers quite narrow play opportunities.

Our Goal

We would like to relocate the play area closer to the main entrance, next to the Museum, where it would be easier to find and it would also be nearer to the museum café and toilets. We have suggested it might replace the lower tennis courts, with the bowling green next to it being replaced with a 'Labyrinth Garden' which could also include sand and water play next to a new family-friendly café.

We would like the new area to feel much more welcoming – nice enough to want to spend plenty time in - and to be of interest to a much wider range of ages and abilities.


Our Thoughts

Sydney Gardens were originally laid out as 'Pleasure Gardens' where people of all ages were entertained in an atmosphere of frivolity and by quirky features such as the Labyrinth and the Supper Boxes. Sydney Gardens is still a popular and well-used open space but over the years has begun to look a little tired. Landscape elements such as planting, paths, and seating all now look in need of upgrading, and the atmosphere of fun and enjoyment has largely been lost.

Our Goal

We would like to restore the sense of fun and surprise to Sydney Gardens so that it feels like a 'Pleasure Gardens' once more. This could be done by including landscape features which have a playful aspect, such as a tree swing, or water spouts appearing as by magic from the ground. We could also improve the general environment- planting, paths etc – so that the Gardens become a more attractive place for a wider range of fun, enjoyable activities such as yoga; dance; performances; music, and so on.




Oak YES This giant leaf-shaped swing is as much an artwork and seat as it is a swing. Something unexpected and surprising; fun for all ages.


Feature Plan showing the potential location of playful features.





Alternative use - Play space with labyrinth? Creation of a Labyrinth Garden with playable features and seating terrace to cafe.






Depot Area
