Services are recommissioned at contract end, creating opportunities to optimize procurement and deliver better value.
Delivery Risk Rating (High/Medium/Low) (Please detail reasons and actions to reduce risk)	Medium – Achieving part-year commissioning savings is difficult due to timing and process constraints. Savings can only start when new contract terms take effect, but existing contracts, required notice periods, and the time needed to implement new suppliers often delay these savings into the next financial period. Commissioners will work with providers of care to identify opportunities to deliver better value throughout the year.
Do the aims of this proposal link to any other budget proposals? (no more than 100 words)	The proposals are linking to the reviews of packages of care, the increase in the reablement proposals and the development of an enablement service. Adult Social Care have a statutory duty to review a person's care package at least once a year. Demand for social care continues to rise with over 2000 requests for assessment made each year. Reablement supports individuals to regain lost skills and confidence after a period of illness, injury, or hospital stay. Enablement is a broader, ongoing approach focused on promoting independence by reducing barriers and building on existing strengths and capabilities, even for those with long-term conditions or disabilities.
