Brief Description and Aim (no more than 100 words)

There is an opportunity to positively impact people we support in B&NES for people aged 16 years old or over and who have a learning disability, physical /sensory needs, mental health need or are Autistic. The approach will be to develop short term pathways of support to maximise independence and resilience.

The aim is to reduce expenditure associated with dependence on formal care services, improve outcomes for people, increase resilience and create further opportunities to increase value for money of commissioned services and increased cross-council working, and to test the concept of an enablement service.

The outcomes and approach have been informed by research into successful enablement models, and work already undertaken with the Mental Health teams recovery model and will broadly support:

- opportunities for further education and employment.
- independent living including access to supported living.
- having friends, relationships and being part of the community.
- being healthy.
- Opportunities for earlier transitions planning to support people and their families to understand and prepare their support going into adulthood

The research and development phase of the initiative will focus on what people can do, what informal support networks they can draw upon and what resources and opportunities there are in the community, to enable people to live enriched and purposeful lives, whilst they retain and maintain a greater level of independence and improved outcome, initially the service would work with:

1. Young People aged 16+ who are beginning their transition journey from Children's to Adult's services. People may already be in receipt of care packages or in the stages of planning the

	 move from an educational care setting to a commissioned formal care service. 2. People currently in receipt of care services to either prevent or delay an increase in services or to enable the reduction or removal of existing services, by creating new pathways, community support, volunteer support, or describing care and support needs separately.
