Bereavement Services Annual Report 2024 - 2025

Introduction

Bereavement Services is a key provider within the Council's portfolio. It provides a service unlike any other, often in a highly charged emotional context for the bereaved. This can be very challenging to everyone concerned, not least the staff who deliver this service all year round.

Many factors affect the number of funerals that are held by Bereavement Services. These factors are out of the control of the Bereavement Services team and are influenced by circumstances such as the national death rate.

The service has numerous Health and safety challenges found only in this industry.

This report looks at what Bereavement Services has achieved over the last financial year and how it is performing in the marketplace.

Background

Bereavement Services are the main provider of cremations and burials within Bath and its surrounding area. As such, it caters for the bereaved population of Bath as the need arises. In addition to this, a vast range of memorial options for ashes (cremated remains) are also available within Haycombe Cemetery coupled with options for memorial trees and benches.

Bereavement Services is legally obligated to facilitate public health funerals under the Public Health Act (Control of diseases) 1984. This means where a person dies within the geographical boundary of Bath and North East Somerset Council, and there is no next of kin or anyone willing or able to take on the responsibility to arrange a funeral, this responsibility falls to the Local Council.

The Council's Bereavement Services team discharges its duty through the operation of 1 crematorium, 2 open cemeteries and 34 closed cemeteries and churchyards.

The main customers of Bereavement Services are Funeral Directors; however, residents can arrange their own loved one's funeral, purchase grave plots and memorials for ashes (cremated remains) directly from us.

Bereavement Services are responsible for the administration, management and operation of Haycombe Cemetery, Haycombe Crematorium, Harptree Cemetery, and the council's closed cemeteries.

The team of twenty comprises of a Bereavement Services Manager; a part-time Assistant Manager Cemeteries, a part-time Assistant Manager Crematorium, a Cemetery Senior Supervisor; a Crematorium Supervisor; five full-time Bereavement Consultants (working in reception); and two Crematorium Technicians who also have grounds maintenance duties in addition to overseeing funeral services in the crematorium chapel and performing crematory duties.

As of June 2019, the cemetery grounds and grave digging work are undertaken by the Bereavement Services internal workforce consisting of a Cemetery Senior Supervisor, two Team Leaders and six Cemetery Operatives. A rolling program of memorial inspections is included in these works alongside grounds maintenance of Haycombe Cemetery, the outer cemeteries and all the grave digging across other council cemetery sites.


Standard office opening hours are 9.00am until 4.00pm, however, staff are available to answer telephone enquiries until 5.00pm. Saturday funeral services are held on request, for which overtime costs are incurred.

Effective from 14th November 2022, our Direct Cremation options were introduced throughout the day, in addition to a price sensitive full-service cremation option conducted by our in-house celebrant held at 9.00am, Monday to Friday. This initiative aims to address funeral poverty, it also provides a further choice for a more affordable option for the bereaved. Our in-house Celebrant is also available to conduct funerals, memorial services, and ashes interments upon request.

Further technology has enabled us to implement a new audio system that is more responsive to the needs of our customers. This new system facilitates live webcasting and provides the capability to display words and images to accompany the service.


- Haycombe Cemetery and Crematorium is within proximity to 11 neighbouring crematoria.
- Five of these are operated by the private sector.
- > All are within 90 minutes travelling time of Haycombe.



Fees and Charges, Cremation.


Bath crematorium sits in seventh place regarding its fee structure for a standard adult cremation, across eleven of the most local Crematoria. Some of these facilities are modern but many have had substantial investment over recent times.


During the Summer of 2022 Haycombe had a full refurbishment of the crematorium chapel, the installation of a new disabled exit ramp and steps, and its waiting room was redecorated along with the installation of digital screens for ease of viewing. Over the early summer period of 2023 the Top Chapel now named the Hilltop Chapel had a complete internal refurbishment, offering a more ambient and befitting environment.




The crematorium

- ➤ Haycombe carried out 1378 cremations in 2023-2024 and has seen a small drop to 1320 cremations in 2024-25.
- ➤ The national statistics office shows 31,850 deaths for the first 6 months of 2024. This figure decreased to 29,438 for the last six months of 2024.
- > There are 20 crematoria within the southwest region.









The service

- > Our busiest cremation service times are between 10.00am and 3.00pm.
- ➤ Unattended Direct Cremations are available throughout the day from 08.30am until 3.30pm.
- ➤ The price sensitive option available at 09.00am with our in-house Celebrant is for a service duration of 20 minutes.
- ➤ The services from 10.00am until 4.00pm are for a 45-minute service duration.
- ➤ Our busiest months for cremation services in 2024-25 were May, February, and March.
