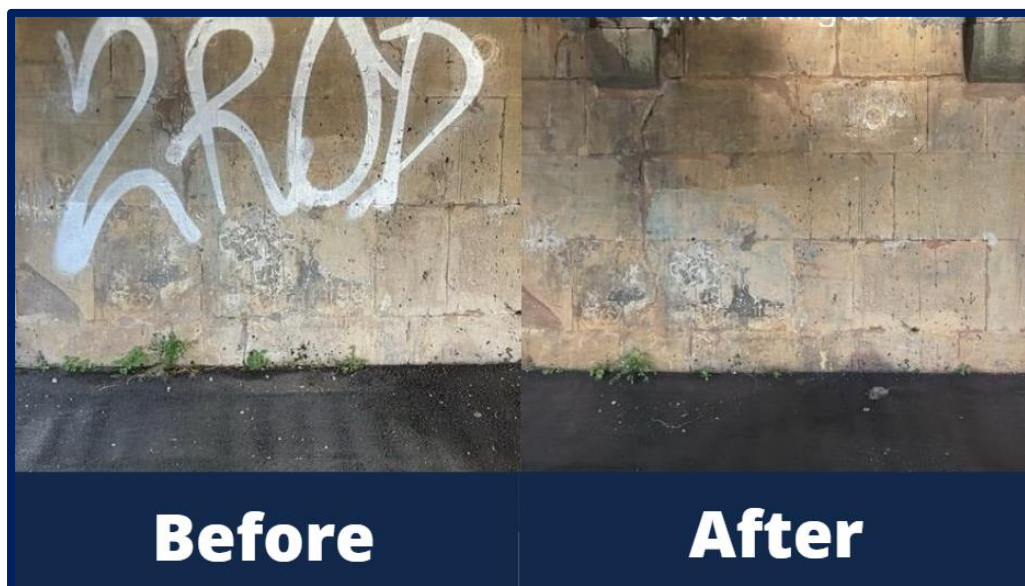
Graffiti Removal

Highway Maintenance and Drainage

Highway Services have continued their important work to keep the district's drainage systems functioning effectively, carrying out regular gully inspections and cleaning.

In October, the team inspected 2662 gullies and cleaned 2353, supporting effective water flow across the network. This proactive work continued into November, with a further 1620 gullies inspected and 1413 cleaned, demonstrating our ongoing commitment to keeping the drainage system clear and resilient.

Enforcement

During October and November, Bath & North East Somerset Council's Enforcement team issued 15 Fixed Penalty Notices for offences including:

- Improper commercial waste handling
- Littering
- Fly-tipping
- Incorrect disposal of controlled waste.

This enforcement activity supports ongoing efforts to maintain a cleaner, safer environment across the district.

During October, our enforcement team investigated two major fly-tipping incidents. Both cases resulted in successful prosecutions

Fixed Penalty Issued Following CCTV Evidence

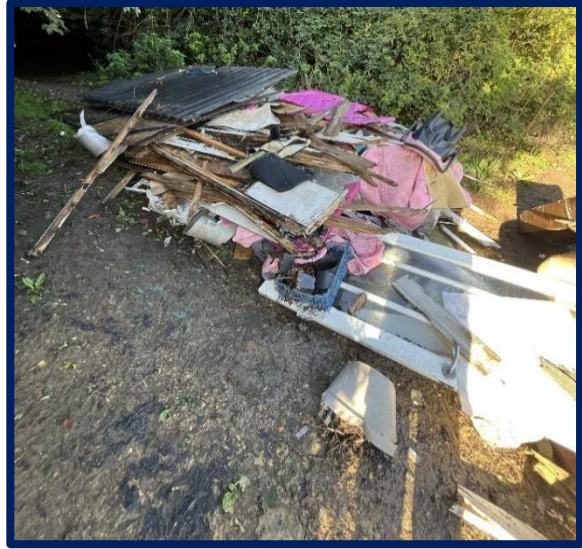
CCTV footage captured an individual illegally dumping a large quantity of apples from a vehicle. The person was interviewed under caution and issued a £400 Fixed Penalty Notice for fly-tipping.



Duty of Care Breaches

Between September and October, two individuals were interviewed in connection with a waste disposal incident in Peasedown St John. Neither had verified the waste carrier's licence or obtained transfer documentation, resulting in Section 34(2a) Residential Duty of Care notices.

The individual responsible for fly-tipping the waste is currently under investigation in a joint operation with Wiltshire Council.

Wider Service Update

Student Community Partnership Door-Knocking Programme

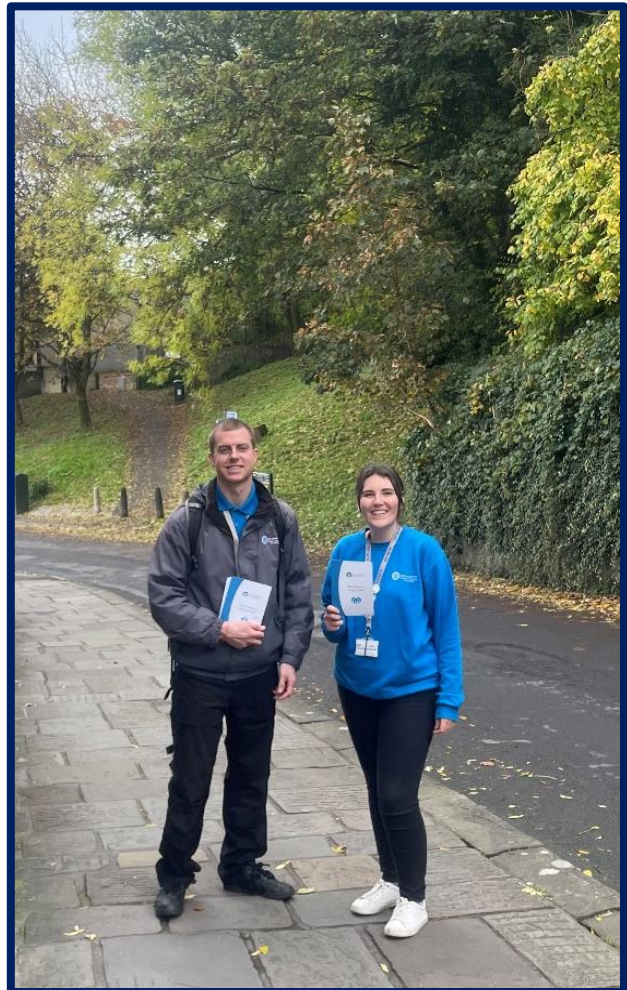
This autumn, council waste officers supported the Student Community Partnership's annual door-knocking initiative. The programme was designed to welcome new and returning students to Bath and provide targeted education on waste management and recycling protocols, river safety awareness, community relations, and neighbourly conduct.

Door knocking covered 109 streets across Bath over a 9-week period.

The educational door-knocking programme was extended this year to include new areas such as Fairfield Park and Larkhall, alongside previous wards, in order to reach more streets.
