Inclusion and SEND Advice Service

The Inclusion and SEND Advice Service provides first-line support to education settings and professionals across Bath and North East Somerset (B&NES), from Early Years to Further Education Colleges, as part of the SEND System of Support. Our mission is to promote inclusive practice and ensure that all children and young people—particularly those with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), vulnerable young people or those receiving suspensions —can access education, feel a sense of belonging, and achieve their full potential.

We support professionals to identify SEND at the earliest opportunity and implement timely, effective provision. Our aim is to strengthen SEND Support, and help settings deliver high-quality, Ordinarily Available Provision, in line with the B&NES SEND Commitment.

What does this include?

Lead Inclusion and SEND Advisors and Lead Inclusion Advisors (SEMH) work directly with settings to support young people who are experiencing challenges and barriers to learning. This work is rooted in a commitment to inclusive education, aiming for early identification of need, effective implementation of provision and a reduction in suspensions and exclusions; ensuring every learner is supported to succeed.

What We Offer?

We provide a wide range of support to promote inclusion and outcomes for learners with SEND and SEMH needs:

- Support for settings in understanding and evaluating their implementation of the B&NES <u>SEND</u>
 Commitment .
- Support to settings in effective implementation of the B&NES Ordinarily Available Provision through a graduated approach.
- Support with writing effective SMART targets and My Plans/SEND Support Plans.
- Individual pupil consultations to discuss concerns, with clear suggested actions for schools that inform inclusive strategies.
- Written reports with clear recommendations.
- Setting visits to observe learners and gather feedback from SENDCos, teachers and pastoral staff.
- Strategic advice to help settings embed inclusive practices and improve SEND and SEMH provision.
- CPD, Training and SEND Surgeries for settings
- Signposting and collaborative working with other commissioned services
