Jewish Burial Ground Boundary Wall Restoration – Final Section

Organisation:

Friends of Bath Jewish Burial Ground – a registered charity (no. 1198905) dedicated to restoring and preserving Bath's historic Jewish Burial Ground.

Funding Requested:

£17,740 from the Bath Neighbourhood Portion of CIL

(Total project cost: £17,740; no additional funding required for this phase)

Project Description:

This project will complete the restoration of the final fifteen metres of the external face of the Bradford Road boundary wall, adjacent to the Bath Jewish Burial Ground. The wall is deteriorating, with loose mortar and crumbling stone posing a safety hazard to pedestrians and cyclists. The restoration will:

Remove hazardous debris

Improve the visual appeal of the streetscape

Preserve a unique historic site reflecting Bath's cultural diversity

This follows a successful 2022 restoration of a 20m section of the same wall, funded by a previous CIL grant.

Key Outcomes:

Improved pedestrian safety

Enhanced public realm and streetscape

Long-term preservation of a Grade II listed heritage site
