Brief Description and Aim (no more than 100 words)	Currently, refuse, recycling, and garden waste collections for residents are scheduled on the same day. Since not all households use the paid garden waste service, having collections on the same day causes uneven workloads during the week in urban areas, making some days busier than others. This scheduling can lead to increased disruptions during periods of high demand, such as in the summer. By reorganising the district's collection zones, the service aims to improve overall efficiency. The proposed changes would result in more evenly distributed routes and balanced workloads, while still ensuring that all residents receive their refuse, recycling, and garden waste collections on the same day in 26/27. Any changes to collection days would be clearly communicated in advance.
