In the spring, we'll ask residents and the school community to complete a short survey and join us at a drop-in session at the school as part of a formal consultation.

If a decision is made to go ahead with the proposals, we'll make any necessary amends, finalise the design, and invite applications for exemptions. We'll also train stewards and work with the school to encourage more active travel. We would aim to launch the School Street in summer 2026.

## How you can help

We'd love the whole community to get behind the plan to help keep children safe.

- ✓ **Choose active travel.** Walking, cycling or scooting even part of the trip reduces congestion around schools and helps children arrive refreshed and ready to learn.
- ✓ **Drive with care.** If you need to drive to school, please slow down, park a little further away and avoid U-turns or sudden manoeuvres. Look out for children crossing between cars.
- ✓ **Avoid idling.** Switching off your engine helps reduce noise and air pollution.
- ✓ **Park considerately.** Please avoid parking on yellow lines, pavements and white or yellow zig zag lines.
- ✓ **Cycle and scoot safely.** Encourage children to slow near the gate and walk bikes or scooters through busy pedestrian areas.
- ✓ **Volunteer as a steward.** We'll train school staff and local volunteers to welcome families and help keep the street calm and car-free during School Street operating hours.



## Working together to improve the school run

We're working with St Phillip's Church of England Primary School on proposals to introduce a School Street on Bloomfield Rise in summer 2026.

This leaflet explains our proposal, how you can share your views, and the simple things we can all do to make the school run safer and calmer for everyone.

## What is a School Street?

School Streets use timed vehicle restrictions on streets outside schools to create safe, calm spaces during drop-off and pick-up. They can apply to a street, part of a street or several streets and are well established across the UK.

Restrictions usually last 30–60 minutes on school days only, and still allow essential access for those who need it. Enforcement is typically managed through signage, stewards, and temporary barriers. In some cases, enforcement cameras are used.

Along with timed restrictions, School Streets encourage more children and families to walk, scoot or cycle their journey to improve their physical and mental health, and to reduce the number of vehicles driving into the neighbourhood.

## Our proposals

We're proposing to restrict through-traffic outside the school on the full length of Bloomfield Rise, during these times:

**8:30am - 9:05am**

**3:00pm - 3:35pm**

**Monday to Friday, term-time only**

Additionally, bollards would restrict access to Bloomfield Rise from the private lanes. Signs would show where the School Street begins and ends.

Trained school staff and volunteer stewards would put up and take down the temporary barrier and collapsible bollard, welcome families, and help manage any essential access, including for residents living on Bloomfield Rise.

## Exemptions

We're proposing that Blue Badge holders, some school transport vehicles and emergency, utility and service vehicles would be able to enter without a permit during School Street times.

Residents living on Bloomfield Rise would be eligible to apply for an exemption permit, and we would also consider permits for families with pupils who have an EHCP or temporary accessibility needs.

Exemptions wouldn't normally be given to residents living outside of the School Street, parents/carers, or school staff.

## How School Streets help
