

Chew Valley Area Forum AGM Report 2022 - 2023

Bath and North East Somerset

Thank you to all the members and participants of the Forum for their contributions over the past year. All the Forum meetings are open to the public and we're always pleased to see new people joining us at meetings. A review of the year

We have continued to meet regularly both online and in person in 2022 and 2023 covering a very wide range of topics.

At our AGM last year, under a theme of 'Preparing for the Future', we received updates on the Local Plan and Health & Wellbeing Strategy which Forum members have helped shape and inform over the year. The second part of the meeting was themed around 'Developing Local Resilience' with a focus on the cost of living crisis and details of where people might go for support, including the Warm Spaces established by local community organisations. The Council's Emergency Planning Team were due to give a presentation on community resilience and the importance of having both local and personal emergency plans but were called away in response to an emergency!

November saw the Forum participate in the Council's budget engagement which focussed on the impact of the cost of living crisis on residents, businesses and the Council's finances.

For the February 2023 meeting, the Forum received an update on Voter ID in advance of the local elections. They also had a request to help promote volunteering opportunities with the Community First Responders/South Western Area Ambulance Service Foundation Trust. The Forum then welcomed Victoria Prescott, the new Chew Valley Reconnected Project Manager with the Council, who explained more about the project and her role. There was an update on the Local Plan and recent workshops held from Richard Daone, Deputy Head of Planning Policy at B&NES. The Forum heard from the Chew Valley Area Forum Climate and Nature Emergency Working Group which sits under the auspices of the Forum. Each of their three sub-groups gave an update on recent activity. The main agenda item was Public Transport and the Forum welcomed Malcolm Parsons, Head of Capital Delivery with the West of England Combined Authority, the regional transport authority to speak about the new WESTlink service.

In July, the Forum met in person for the first time since February 2020. Alex Easton from the Community First responders reported that they now have four volunteers supporting emergency medical services in the area. The Forum also received updates on the Local Plan from Richard Daone - Deputy Head of Planning Policy, B&NES along with an update on the Joint Health & Wellbeing Strategy, which launched in June, from Becky Reynolds - Director of Public Health. The Chew Valley Area Climate and Nature Emergency Working Group announced that their Nature Recovery sub-group had now agreed to become an autonomous constituted group and will be linking with the Chew Valley Reconnected Project. There was an update on this from Project Manager, Victoria Prescott who is working with Bristol Avon Rivers Trust (BART). She introduced Dr Amy Wade from BART who gave a presentation on their Water Resources and Community Resilience Project. The final presentation was on the West of England Combined Authority's Somer Valley Links and Bristol - Bath Corridor Projects.

We have been fortunate to have the Police attending many of our Forum meetings. We appreciate that they are operational so it's not always possible for them to join us however they continue to provide us with valuable information on crime trends in the area and address concerns raised.

Looking ahead

Following the local elections in May, a new B&NES Cabinet Member, Cllr David Wood - Deputy Leader (Council Priorities & Delivery) was given responsibility for engagement. Cllr Wood attended the July 2023 Forum meetings asking for your feedback and ways in which we can make the Forums as valuable to participants as possible. We also welcome suggestions for future Agenda items. Please do get in touch with any thoughts you might have (*contact details at Appendix 3*).

Many of the topics discussed by the Forums over the past year fit into a wider agenda for Place based working approaches being developed within the Council and the Integrated Neighbourhood teams of the NHS.

The Council has assigned to senior officers, geographic areas based on the Forum boundaries. The aim is to improve co-ordination, local knowledge and understanding of community priorities. For the Chew Valley Area, the Place Lead is Jackie Clayton - Head of Green Transformation (job share) at the Council. We look forward to her regular updates at future meetings.

We also look forward to hearing more from the NHS around their Integrated Neighbourhood Teams approach and how we, as communities, can support this.

Communication is a key part of our ongoing engagement. The Forums play a valuable role in ensuring information about consultations, future developments and community priorities are discussed and shared. We can help each other by staying connected and we would encourage all Forum members to sign up to receive the [Council's e-newsletter](#) and the Connecting Communities Team's [Interagency e-bulletin](#). The purpose of the Forums is to:

The Forums are attended by Bath & North East Somerset Ward Councillors, Parishes, local community groups and residents. All Forum meetings are open to anyone to attend at any time.

The agendas for Forum meetings generally include items the Council and its partners want to share or would like feedback on; items the Forum members themselves wish to discuss and opportunities for local organisations to share information and best practice.

The Forums provide grass roots engagement with residents and community organisations, not only for the Council but also its partners such as the Police, health care providers etc. Feedback from the Forums plays a vital role in helping to shape local services. A 'one size fits all' approach does not always work in the diverse communities across our district which include very rural areas alongside a World Heritage City.

It's also important to recognise that the Forums are not defined by their meetings alone. The knowledge gained and shared, the contacts made and networks created all assist in strengthening our communities.
