### Community Action

On 31 January, the Student Community Partnership organised a litter pick in the community. Student volunteers and Cllr June Player joined the SCP Community Wardens to clear litter along West Avenue, Brook Road and Millmead Road in Westmoreland.

## Keeping B&NES Clean and Green

Our teams from Cleansing and Parks and Green Spaces have been busy responding to FixMyStreet reports. These reports relate to overgrown vegetation, cleaning of road signs, weeding, sweeping and litter picking. In January, the teams fixed and closed **69** reports.

## Environmental Enforcement

The Environmental Enforcement team can take action against individuals who commit environmental crimes such as antisocial behaviour that harms the safety or quality of life of the community. In January, the team issued **51** fixed penalty notices related to commercial waste, littering, fly-tipping, and escape of controlled waste.



The team issued several fixed penalty notices to different offenders due to individuals discarding their waste into a bin store. Offenders caught littering were fined between £100 and £150.

## Reuse Shop

Our Keynsham shop works with local charities to divert good-condition items from going to waste. The shop collaborates with Mercy in Action, the Petra Project, Julian House, Sofa Project, and Small Stuff Baby Bank. In partnership with Bath Share and Repair, the charity collects small household electrical items which their team PAT tests to ensure the donated products can be sold back into the community. We recently joined up with Small Stuff Baby Bank to provide donations of pre-school to infant supplies. This allows essential items to circulate back into the community, supporting families, carers, and schools.



In January, the Reuse Shop also had a two-week, 50% off sale that coincided with Keep Britain Tidy's #BuyNothingNewMonth. The popular sale generated high footfall, encouraged people to buy sustainably and promoted waste reduction.

## Highway Maintenance and Drainage

In January, the team inspected **1026** gullies and of which **924** were cleaned. It was a challenging month with prolonged periods of wet and cold weather, and the operational demands this placed on our resources from having to undertake gritting runs. The wet weather at the beginning of January resulted in us completing a higher than usual number of reactive jobs, which are more complex than routine maintenance, resulted in lower than usual numbers.
