NOTICE is given that the Bath and North East Somerset Council has made an order under provisions contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will introduce the following variations to restrictions in **South East Outer Area, Bath**:-

- 1. Introduce No Parking At Any Time in lengths of Wellsway, Beechen Cliff Road, Summer Lane, Beechwood Road, Entry Hill, Upper Bloomfield Road, Clarks Way, Bloomfield Road, Bloomfield Drive, Bath.
- 2. Introduce a Disabled Parking bays in lengths of St Luke's Road, Widcombe / Lyncombe, Bath.
- 3. Extension of Zone 9 boundary and introduction of Zone 9 Permit Holder Only parking in lengths of Prospect Road, Widcombe, Bath.
- 4. Introduce dual use Zone 9 Permit Holder / 2 Hour Limited Waiting parking in lengths of Prospect Road, Widcombe, Bath.
- 5. Introduce a dual use Zone 21 Permit Holder / 4 Hour Limited Waiting parking bay in lengths of Perrymead, Lyncombe, Bath.
- 6. Extend the Zone 21 boundary at the southern end of Perrymead, Lyncombe, Bath.
- 7. Introduce No Parking Between 7.30am 9.30am, Monday Friday in lengths of Claverton Down Road, Bath.
- 8. Extend the operating hours of the 2 Hour Limited Waiting bays on Church Street, Widcombe, Bath to 7 days a week.
- 9. Introduce dual use Zone 22 Permit Holder and 2 Hour Limited Waiting in lengths of Entry Hill and Wellsway, Widcombe / Lyncombe, Bath.
- 10. Introduce dual use Zone 18 Permit Holder and 2 Hour Limited Waiting in lengths of Hatfield Road, Widcombe / Lyncombe, Bath.
- 11. Introduce a Bus Stop Clearway in lengths of Mulberry Park, Combe Down, Bath.

The order will come into operation on 1st March 2024. Full details of the proposal together with a map and a Statement of the Council's Reasons for making the order may be inspected at the One Stop Shops at Manvers Street, Bath, The Hollies, High Street, Midsomer Norton and at the Civic Centre, Market Walk, Keynsham during normal office hours. Any person who desires to question the validity of, or any provision contained in the order on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any of the relevant requirements of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the order, may within six weeks after the date on which the order was made, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
