

- Over recent centuries the Bristol-Avon catchment area has lost most of its woodland.
- Currently, the West of England's tree cover rate is 7.8%, far lower than the UK average of 13.2%.







- Trees sequester carbon, but ongoing maintenance is needed for long term impact. That's why we create permanent woodland.
- 41% of UK **species are in decline**. Woodland creation, as part of a mosaic of habitats, and especially in identified Nature Recovery Networks, will allow nature to thrive and recover.
- We work with the Environment Agency to identify locations where woodland creation will provide **natural flood defences**.
- Volunteering to plant trees, or just spending time in our spaces, improves health and wellbeing.
