(26-043A) NOTICE is given that the Bath and North East Somerset Council proposes to exercise its powers conferred by section 90A of The Highways Act 1980, for the installation of road humps in the road as specified below:

Shakespeare Avenue, Bear Flat, Bath	At the junction with the A367 Wellsway.
Bruton Avenue, Bear Flat, Bath	At the junction with the A367 Wellsway
Hayes Place, Bear Flat, Bath	At the junction with the A367 Wellsway
Bloomfield Avenue, Bear Flat, Bath	At the junction with the A367 Wellsway

(26-043B) NOTICE is given that the Bath and North East Somerset Council proposes to make an order under provisions contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will introduce the following variations to restrictions in the Bear Flat, Bath Area as specified below:

- Introduce Double Yellow Line restrictions on A367 Wellsway, Bloomfield Avenue and Shakespeare Avenue, Bath.
- Introduce a Loading Bay operating 10am – 6pm on the A367 Wellsway, Bath.
- Introduce a Goods Vehicles Only Loading Bay operating at all times on the A367 Wellsway, Bath.
- Relocation of the existing X2 Bus Stops and Bus Cages on the A367 Wellsway, Bath.
- Reduction of 1 Hour Limited Waiting by 1 cars length on Hayes Place, Bath.

(26-043C) NOTICE is given that Bath and North East Somerset Council proposes to make an order under provisions contained in the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984, the effect of which will:

- Prohibited the driving of a motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 20 miles in lengths of the A367 Wellsway.
- Introduce a bus lane operating between 07:00 and 10:00 Monday – Friday on Bloomfield Road and A367 Wellsway.
