**SHOPHOUSE ROAD, TWERTON, BATH
**(ZEBRA PEDESTRIAN CROSSING) (RAISED TABLE SPEED HUMP)
(CONSTRUCTION OF ROAD HUMPS) 2026****

NOTICE is given that Bath and North East Somerset Council proposes to exercise its powers conferred by section 23 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, by the installation of a Zebra Crossing in the road as specified in this Notice.

- Shophouse Road, Bath centred approximately 6.8 metres south of its junction with Highland Road.

NOTICE is given that Bath and North East Somerset Council in exercise of the powers conferred by section 90A of the Highways Act 1980 ('the Act') and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with section 90C(1) of the Act and those bodies or persons prescribed by the Highways (Road Humps) Regulations 1999 ('the Regulations') and in accordance with section 90C(2) of the Act intends to construct a road hump in the form of a raised table and road humps at the locations specified in this Notice.

- (Raised Table Speed Hump) Shophouse Road, Bath approximately 38 metres south of its junction with Highland Road.
- (Construction of Road Humps) Shophouse Road, Bath Speed cushions set 1: approximately 20 metres east of its junction with Priddy Close.
- (Construction of Road Humps) Shophouse Road, Bath Speed cushions set 2: approximately 38 metres west of its junction with Priddy Close.

A copy of the map, together with a statement of the Council's reasons may be inspected at The One Stop Shops at 3-4 Manvers Street, Bath 3, The Hollies Midsomer Norton and at the Keynsham Civic Centre, Market Walk, Keynsham during normal office hours.
