



## Primary Co-ordinated Admission Scheme Reception Admissions Academic Year 2020/21 - Statement of Options

The information contained in this document explains the options available to applicants for **Bath & North East Somerset Schools only.** Whilst other Admission Authorities may have similar procedures, if you are considering applying/appealing for a school outside of Bath & North East Somerset, you should contact the relevant Admission Authority for further information before completing and returning the enclosed Parental Notification Form by the requested date.

### **OPTION 1:** To accept the place offered.

If you wish to accept a place at the school offered please fill in section A of the enclosed response form and send it to Admissions & Transport, People & Communities Department, Lewis House, Manvers Street, Bath, BA1 1JG by the requested date. Alternatively if you applied on line, if you prefer, you can log back into the online system (with your password) and accept your place. Please also indicate in the memo box when you wish your child to start school, September, January or April.

The Headteacher of the offered school will be informed of the acceptance in due course and will then contact you about admission arrangements etc.

#### OPTION 2: To put your child's name on a waiting list but not formally appeal.

By asking to go on the waiting list your child can still be reconsidered for any places that may become available at your preferred school(s) even if you do not want to make a formal appeal for the school concerned. If you choose this option you will not have an appeal hearing scheduled. The place offered at the alternative school will be held without prejudice but if at a later stage you are offered a place at your preferred school then the place at the original school offered would be cancelled.

To choose this option please tick the 'waiting list' box under section B of the enclosed response form and send it to Admissions & Transport, People & Communities Department, Lewis House, Manvers Street, Bath, BA1 1JG by the requested date. If at any time you decide you no longer want your child's details to remain on the waiting list you will need to confirm this in writing to Admissions & Transport.

Places at schools may become available if other parents change their mind and don't accept the place they have been offered or move out of the area. Waiting lists are held in criteria order and consist of those children whose parents have:-

- Asked for their child's name to be put on the list for the school.
- Appealed for a place at the school.
- Made a late application naming the school.

If places do become available, these will be allocated by the school's Admission Authority using the admissions criteria and giving equal consideration to all three categories of children on the waiting list. However children who are the subject of a direction by a Local Authority to admit or who are allocated to a school in accordance with a Fair Access Protocol must take precedence over those on a waiting list.

# PLEASE NOTE A CHILD'S POSITION ON THE WAITING LIST CAN MOVE UP OR DOWN IF WITHDRAWALS OR LATE APPLICATIONS ARE RECEIVED.

Please also note that the waiting list will automatically cease at the end of the 2020/21 academic year. Should parents/carers want their child's name held on the waiting list for the following academic year then they would need to put this request in writing to the relevant Admission Authority for the school.

# OPTION 3: <u>To appeal against the Admission Authority's decision to refuse a place at your original preferred school(s).</u>

All schools have an Admissions Authority. For Community and Voluntary Controlled Schools the Local Authority (LA) is the Admissions Authority. For Foundation and Voluntary Aided Schools it is the Governing Body of the school and for Academy Schools it is the Academy Trust.



Under the terms of the School Standards & Framework Act 1998 if you have been refused one or more of your school preferences you can appeal for a place at each of the schools involved. There can be different grounds for refusal and the covering letter will specify on what grounds your child has been refused a place at your 1<sup>st</sup> preference school.

The circumstances in which an appeal panel can uphold an appeal for the admission of a child to a school is limited in the case of Infant Class Size appeals. Where the admission authority has refused a place on the grounds that admission would cause prejudice as a result of relevant measures which would need to be taken to comply with the duty to limit infant class size this is referred to as class size prejudice. This category of appeal can only now be upheld if an appeal panel is satisfied that either:

- a) the child would have been offered a place if the admission arrangements had been properly implemented; and/or.
- b) the decision to refuse admission was not one which a reasonable admission authority would make in the circumstances of the case.

This means that the appeal panel, if they make a clear decision that there is 'class size prejudice' will consider your case taking into account the above limitations. If the appeal panel find that class size prejudice has not been proven then they can then consider your own special circumstances together with the admission authority's reasons for refusal.

# YOU HAVE A 20 SCHOOL DAY PERIOD FROM THE DATE OF THE ENCLOSED NOTIFICATION LETTER REGARDING YOUR SCHOOL APPLICATION WITHIN WHICH TO PREPARE AND LODGE YOUR WRITTEN APPEAL.

If you intend to appeal there are two things you need to do:-

- 1. Tick the 'appeal' box under Section B on the enclosed Parental Notification response form and return this to the Postal Address at: Admissions & Transport, People & Communities Department, Lewis House, Manvers Street, Bath, BA1 1JG by the requested date as shown on the response form. This ensures the Local Authority is aware of your intentions.
- 2. Prepare and lodge your written appeal(s) with the school's admission authority within the 20 school day period. This date is mentioned on the individual school allocation statement where it also gives information about the address to send your written appeal. Please note if you are appealing for more than one school, separate letters of appeal must be submitted for each school concerned. Independent Appeals Panels cannot consider cases unless parents have made their appeal in writing and given their reasons for wanting a particular school.

If you decide to lodge an appeal for any school a place will be held open for you at the school you have been offered until the result of the appeal is known. Your child's name will also be added to the waiting list for the school(s) concerned.

Appeals are heard by an independent panel which has the power to overrule the Admission Authority's decision. It is anticipated that appeals will be heard during Terms 5 & 6. You would be given the opportunity to attend the appeal hearing and more information about the appeal hearings would be sent to you nearer the time. If a place becomes available for your child then the appeal hearing would be cancelled.

If at any time you decide to withdraw your formal appeal you will need to confirm this in writing to the relevant Admissions Authority and to the Local Authority. Your child's details would also at that stage be withdrawn from the waiting list unless you notified that you wanted their details to remain.

### OPTION 4: To apply for a place at an alternative school.

You can discuss the availability of places at alternative school(s) by telephoning the Admissions & Transport Team. Please be aware that no verbal offers of places at alternative schools will be made. All requests have to be made on the attached response form. This request can be instead of or in addition to lodging a formal appeal for your preferred school. Please note that completion of this section of the form does not guarantee a place at the alternative named school. The outcome of this request will be confirmed in writing. If you want to apply for an alternative school place please tick the 'new preference' box under section B of the enclosed response form and send it to Admissions & Transport, People & Communities Department, Lewis House, Manvers Street, Bath, BA1 1JG by the requested date. Alternatively if you applied on line, if you prefer, you can log back into the online system (with your password) and indicate your new school preference.

Declining a school place offered - Please complete section C of the response form so that we can update our records.
