## BATH AND NORTH EAST SOMERSET COUNCIL (PUBLIC FOOTPATHS BA5/6 & BA24/12, CHURCH STREET, CHARLCOMBE) TEMPORARY TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER 2024

Notice is given that Bath and North East Somerset Council in exercise of its powers under section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 has made an order to temporarily introduce a path closure to the section of Public Footpath BA5/6 commencing from a junction with Church Street at grid reference ST 7495 6851 (Point A on the Notice Plan) and proceeding in a generally easterly direction for approximately 398 metres to a junction with Public Footpath BA24/12 at grid reference ST 7533 6847 (Point B on the Notice Plan); and the section of Public Footpath BA24/12 commencing from a junction with Public Footpath BA5/6 at grid reference ST 7533 6847 (Point B on the Notice Plan) and proceeding in a generally south-easterly direction for approximately 289 metres to a junction with Public Footpath BA24/11 at grid reference ST 7557 6834 (Point C on the Notice Plan).

This temporary closure is required because of the likelihood of danger to the public, namely the danger caused by a collapsed footbridge which requires replacement before the footpaths can once again be used safely. The Order will come into force on 19 March 2024 (continuing the emergency 21-day closure put in place on 27 February 2024) and will be effective for six months.


