Notice is given that Bath and North East Somerset Council in exercise of its powers under section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 has temporarily introduced a path closure with immediate effect on the section of Public Footpath BA5/6 commencing from a junction with Church Street at grid reference ST 7495 6851 (Point A on the Notice Plan) and proceeding in a generally easterly direction for approximately 398 metres to a junction with Public Footpath BA24/12 at grid reference ST 7533 6847 (Point B on the Notice Plan); and the section of Public Footpath BA24/12 commencing from a junction with Public Footpath BA5/6 at grid reference ST 7533 6847 (Point B on the Notice Plan) and proceeding in a generally south-easterly direction for approximately 289 metres to a junction with Public Footpath BA24/11 at grid reference ST 7557 6834 (Point C on the Notice Plan).

This temporary closure is required because of the likelihood of danger to the public, namely the danger caused by a collapsed footbridge which requires replacement before it can once again be used safely. The closure has come into force with immediate effect and will be effective for 21 days.


