FOR THE ATTENTION OF ALL PUBLIC FOOTPATH USERS

Bath and North East Somerset Council are proposing to change the Public Rights of Way network in respect of public footpaths BA27/19 and BA27/20 at Riverside, Temple Street in the Parish of Keynsham

The general effect of the proposal is shown on the attached Plan. The routes to be stopped up are shown as solid red lines and the proposed routes are shown as solid green lines.


The section of public footpath:


- 1. BA27/19 commencing from point A on the Plan to point B would be stopped up. The proposed new line runs from point K through points L, M, N, P to point Q;
- 2. BA27/19 commencing from point F continuing to point G would be stopped up. The proposed new line runs from point F to point V; and
- 3. BA27/20 commencing from point A continuing to point C would be stopped up. The proposed new line runs from point H through points J, K to point W; and
- 4. BA27/20 commencing from point D continuing to point E would be stopped up. The proposed new line runs from point R through points S, T to point U.

The changes would be achieved by way of a diversion order made under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 ('the Act'). These changes are proposed in the interests of the landowner as development was carried out many years ago making the current definitive line of the footpaths unavailable for use. The changes will provide improved public rights of way. The proposed new footpaths would be without any limitations.
