

## Bear Flat or Twerton village into town

7 Steep with interesting views .approx 1 mile / 8 An easy walk along Avon riverside path approx 1.75 miles


From Bear Flat Start: The Bear Pub. Bus: First. Nos 13 or 14.

**Key**: → proceed to ✓ safety advice From Bear Pub ↔ road by pedestrian crossing → left by Cooperative shop and ↔ pavement with railings → Holloway, a name possibly derived from the 'sunken road' of the Roman Fosse Road followed by pilgrims en route for Glastonbury. (Alternatively 'Holy Way') Continue down (✓ steep road) , ↔ Magdalene Road and Magdalene Chapel on left. One of the oldest buildings in Bath and believed to be a resting place for pilgrims. A small detour up steps opposite Magdalene Road takes you to Magdalene Gardens & a viewing point over the city rooftops. For city centre → Holloway and path by Wells Road ↔ by subway, to arches under railway bridge → pedestrian bridge over River Avon ↔ pedestrian crossings to Southgate shopping and up to the city centre. (→ for Bus & Rail Stations).

From Twerton village The name for the village of Twerton is thought to originate from it's location close to a weir on the River Avon approximately 1.5 miles south west side of the city. The riverside location was also a reason for the development of a cloth industry as the basis for the village's industrial heritage.

Start: West end of the village at Watery Lane, or High St by the Full Moon Pub. Bus: First No. 5 – to High Street

There are two options for the start of the walk, the first uses a new footpath across Weston Island, but includes a difficult road crossing. The second uses a pedestrian crossing and a footbridge. a From the Full Moon Public House ↔ road to a footpath down & through a Railway arch under Great Western line. At main road (A36 Lwr. Bristol Rd.) pause and consider traffic ( care - the traffic island can be helpful to cross this busy road with fast traffic)  $\leftrightarrow$  to opposite side.  $\rightarrow$  right a few metres  $\rightarrow$  left to bridge for First Bus Depot & take footpath across bridge. Follow the path around Weston Island → to the bridge over the river and join the riverside path to Bath. or b → High Street (look out for City Farm behind Bath City Football Club)→ end turn right at the main road to Bath, walk to ↔ Lansdown View, ↔ pedestrian crossing over to the bus stop → Fieldings Road between the pub and the factory to the bridge over the river. At north side ↔ grass to the river-side path & left towards town. Walk along the path enjoying the scenery, and pass under three road bridges. ( the third, is an early example, albeit small, of a suspension (Victoria) Bridge, built in 1836). Soon after you leave the path left → to a row of cottages (Nelson Place). Pass green in front of Norfolk Crescent ( a part 18c & part a modern facade-Soriginal watchman's tower ) ↔ Nile St. & Great Stanhope St. → New King Street to Charles St. For town centre ↔ toucan (pedestrian) crossing → left to Monmouth St. → right here to reach the Theatre Royal, or



Kingsmead Square.
