 - Increasing innovation and competition in public procurement




The Early Days


- First launched in February 2011

- Considered "adequate" advertising by Government
- Usage not mandatory






Lord Young Review 2010-2015









Lord Young's Findings

- Key elements for growth:
 - Confidence
 - Capability
 - Coherence

Public procurement:

- Visibility
- Bureaucracy
- Payment



The Public Contracts Regulations 2015

- Brought the revised EU Public Procurement Directive into UK law
- Added regulations that legally enforce recommendations from the Young Review
- Made the use of Contracts Finder mandatory



The New Contracts Finder

- Launched February 2015
- Now part of GOV.UK

- Home > Business and self-employed > Sale of goods and services and data protection

 Contracts Finder

 Contracts Finder lets you search for information about contracts worth over £10,000 with the government and its agencies.
- Mandatory requirement for publication of contract opportunities and awarded contracts over £25k (£10k for Central Government)
- Opportunities must be advertised on Contracts Finder even if they are already advertised on OJEU



Features of Contracts Finder

- No need to register to search for ITTs
- Registration enables personalised alerts
- The system includes pre-market engagement opportunities
- Platform optimised for mobile devices
