Energy Advice, First Wednesday of the month, Bath	Residents wanting to reduce their bills or insulate their homes will be able to get guidance from trained energy experts at a monthly pop-up event in Bath. Staff from the Centre for Sustainable Energy (CSE) will be manning a stall outside Bath Central Library on the first Wednesday of every month The Centre for Sustainable Energy, based in Bristol, is a national charity supporting people and organisations across the UK to tackle the climate emergency and end the suffering caused by cold homes. Their Home Energy Team provides residents in B&NES with free, local and impartial energy advice. The CSE staff can answer questions and provide information about saving energy in the home, keeping warm in winter and lowering fuel bills. They can also explain how to adjust your thermostat, the best way to use electric storage heaters or how to draught proof or insulate your home. Residents can also get help managing their gas and electricity bills and find out about any financial assistance which may be available. Residents on low incomes can find out if they are eligible for energy related home improvement grant schemes such as Bright Green Homes, which could fund the installation of insulation, glazing, heat pumps or solar panels. The CES stall will be in place on the first Wednesday of every month, at the top of the stairs in the Podium, from 11am to 2pm. Further information on can be found on the CSE website, which contains plenty of information about saving energy around the home.

Retrofit Skills Bootcamps, WECA	A new training programme to provide West of England residents with retrofit skills to power the region's net-zero drive has been launched by WECA.
	Skills Bootcamps offer free flexible courses up to 16 weeks, giving people the opportunity to build up sector-specific skills and fast track or launch their career in retrofit. They are designed to ensure adults are able to retrain and upskill whatever their starting point, providing clear line of site to a new role, opportunity or contract.
	As long as you are over 19 and live or work in areas offering Bootcamps you will be eligible. That includes unemployed, employed and self- employed. The bootcamps are flexible and will involve online guided learning designed to work around your schedule, workshops and assignments.
