Part of BSIP Fund

Designed by local people for local people

Grant fund for 1 year from April 2024 with potential to extend to 2yrs

Innovative, new routes, community designed

Outline proposal: Commuter Route to Bristol



Based on outcomes of 'Getting to Work on Time' report


Bookable commuter bus (up to 1 week ahead) with 'hop on' option

Monday to Friday (excluding bank holidays) x 1 return per day

Membership scheme (with non-member 'hop on' potential)

£2 per single journey (£4 per day)

Walk, cycle, ebike or WESTlink to one of the 3 hubs
